Restorative justice is an approach to justice that focuses on repairing the harm caused by criminal behavior through inclusive processes that engage all stakeholders. It emphasizes accountability, making amends, and facilitating healing for victims, offenders, and the community. Unlike traditional justice systems, which often prioritize punishment, restorative justice seeks to understand the root causes of wrongdoing and to foster rehabilitation and reconciliation. Key practices include victim-offender mediation, community service, and restorative circles, aiming to build a sense of empathy, responsibility, and closure for all involved.
